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


Air Force Association Virtual STEM DAY

The Air Force Association (AFA) has long believed in the power of education and technology to transform the lives of Airmen and the American public they faithful serve. Education and technology have enabled our organization and its members to adapt and overcome great trials throughout history, with

no more recent example than the COVID-19 epidemic. Despite quarantine restrictions, AFA Ch 309 developed a new way to promote Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) education in our local Space Coast community with the first-ever AFA Virtual STEM Day!

Virtual STEM Day debuted on May 15, 2020 over web-based application Zoom. AFA Chapter 309 invited military and civilian experts assigned to Patrick Air Force Base to participate in a STEM panel intended to education Merritt Island High School senior students on potential career tracks.

The five-member panel presented on the chemistry, electrical engineering, nuclear science, geophysics, and various specializations like radio frequency propagation, telecommunications, engineering management and more! The virtual platform allowed the experts to share their stories and interact with the students one-on-one.

The Seniors were exited to hear about the education and life experiences of our expert panel. They were surprised to discover most of the experts never imagined their current career success in their early education years. The panel's advice was simple... "pursue your passion and be open to opportunities... you never know where life will lead you!"

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Space Coast is Home to the Florida Teacher of the Year 2020

When the Cape Canaveral AFA Chapter received the Teacher of the Year Package from West Shore Junior/Senior High School's principal, Mr. Rick Fleming, there was no doubt they had an outstanding candidate. Their intuition was "spot on", as Ms. Jill Whitacre was selected as the Chapter Elementary Teacher of the Year and was just selected to be Florida AFA Teacher of the Year. Ms. Whitacre has been inspiring young people for twenty years. This past school year, she taught 7th and 8th graders in math and robotics. It was twelve years ago, when she started West Shore's first Lego League

Team for 4^{th} through 6^{th} grades. In 2014, she initiated a Robotics Program, which is going strong to date. Particularly noteworthy, is that 40 - 60% of those in the Robotics Program are female. Continuing

evidence of her work to inspire young women to pursue STEM studies, was her recent trip to the Air Force Technical Application Center (AFTAC). There she had 8th and 9th grade young ladies take part in the Women in Science and Engineering Symposium (WiSE) for a STEM Pioneer Hands on Day. Her students have even traveled to Europe to compete in the Monaco Mousetrap Grand Prix Finals; placing second as they were up against teams from France, Italy, and Monaco.

Ms. Whitacre is a superior classroom teacher, whose dedication is unmatched. Her principal commented that her car was typically the first in the parking lot, as she works with her Lego team,

ninety minutes before school begins. In addition to inspiring and directly contributing to STEM studies, she ensures young ladies know the challenges that women before them have met and overcome. Her "Whirly-Girls", an all-female Drone Team, took their name from the first all-female helicopter pilots who flew during the Vietnam War. This team traveled to Tallahassee to meet with State legislators in furthering the promotion of STEM education.

Ms. Whitacre is the epitome of a dedicated, passionate teacher committed to helping prepare the future STEM workforce of Florida, and the Cape Canaveral AFA Chapter is very proud of our association with her!
